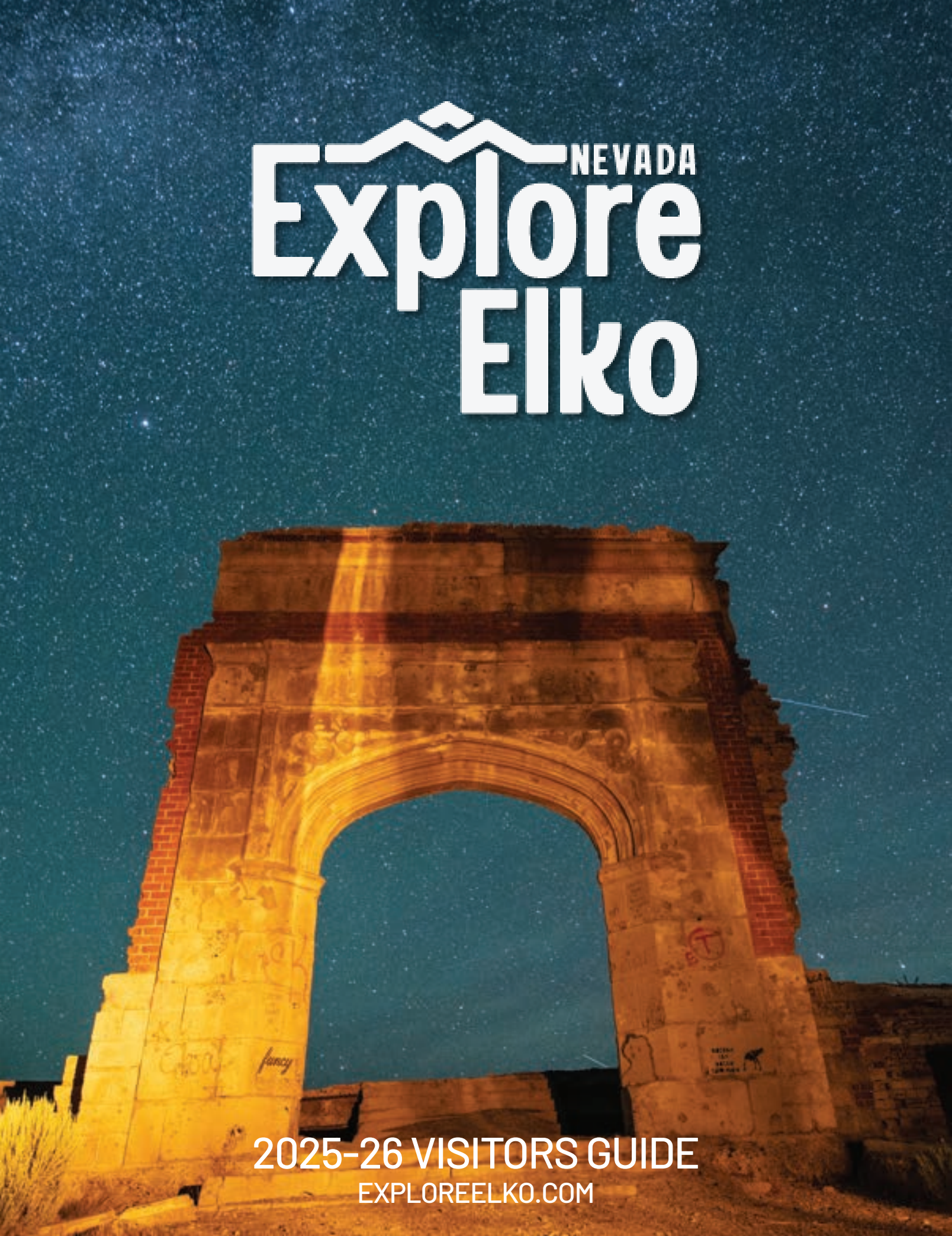

TRANSPORTATION

Elko is in the northeastern corner of the State of Nevada, situated on the Humboldt River between Reno, Nevada and Salt Lake City, Utah. There are several options to make your way to Elko, be it planes, trains or automobiles.

The Elko Regional Airport terminal features a spacious waiting area, rental car companies and a small art gallery. The airport has two asphalt runways, one spanning over 7,000 ft. in length. Aircraft of all sizes can be accommodated at the Elko Airport, including Air Force One!

The high desert communities throughout Elko County experience all four seasons, each bringing wonderful opportunities for outdoor recreation, event participation and enjoying all the area has to offer. Elko has an annual average precipitation of less than 10 inches, which comes mostly in the form of snowfall during winter months.

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FREE THINGS TO DO IN AND AROUND ELKO



HISTORY & CULTURE

• California Trail Interpretive Center:

Located a few miles west of Elko, this museum is a fascinating and free-to-enter facility managed by the Bureau of Land Management. It offers interactive exhibits and outdoor trails that tell the stories of the pioneers who traveled the California Trail.

• Self-Guided Mural & Public Arts

Tour: Elko has a vibrant public art scene, and you can take a free self-guided tour of the many murals that adorn buildings throughout the downtown area. The murals depict local history, culture, and stunning landscapes. The Elko Centennial Tower is a unique piece of public art is a towering tribute to the city's heritage in the railroad, mining, and gambling industries right in downtown Elko. Designed to look like an old mining rig, complete with train tracks and a water tank, it offers a great photo opportunity. For the best view, visit at night when the iconic "ELKO" sign at the top is lit up, changing colors seasonally like a vintage casino marquee.

• **Historic Sherman Station:** The Elko Area Chamber of Commerce and Visitor Center is located in the historic Sherman Station, a log cabin that was once a stagecoach stop and post office. You can stop by to learn about local history, view photos, and get information on other free activities in the area.

• The Northeastern Nevada

Museum: While it does have a small admission fee for non-members, the Northeastern Nevada Museum offers free admission to active military and members. It's a great place to explore local history, art, and wildlife dioramas.

• Cowboy Arts & Gear Museum:

Located in downtown Elko,

this museum showcases the craftsmanship and history of Western gear and art. It's a must-see for anyone interested in cowboy culture and is typically free to enter.

PARKS & OUTDOORS

• **City of Elko Parks:** Elko has several public parks that are free to use. These parks, such as Angel Park and Elko City Park, offer playgrounds, picnic areas, and walking paths.

• **Humboldt Area Recreation Plan (HARP) Trail:** This trail system provides a great way to walk, run, or bike and explore the city's natural areas.

• **Lamoille Canyon Scenic Byway:** While a small fee may be required for camping in the area, driving the Lamoille Canyon Scenic Byway is a free and breathtaking experience. This stunning drive offers spectacular views of the Ruby Mountains, waterfalls, and alpine lakes.

• **South Fork State Recreation Area:** Located about 16 miles south of Elko, South Fork is a popular spot for fishing and boating. While there is a fee for day-use and camping, you can still drive through and enjoy the scenic views of the reservoir and surrounding landscape. You can also explore the park on its walking trails.

• **Wild Horse State Recreation Area:** While there is a fee for day-use and camping, this remote area north of Elko is free to drive through and explore its trails and scenery. Keep an eye out for wildlife.

• **Stargazing:** Due to its remote location and minimal light pollution, Elko County is an excellent place for stargazing. Simply find a spot away from the city lights and look up at the vast night sky.

CALIFORNIA TRAIL JOURNEY

- Experience the 20-million-dollar California Trail Center 8 miles west of Elko-Hunter Exit 292. Discover life-size dioramas, outdoor displays, the iconic Elephant, and plenty more to see! 775-738-1849 www.californiatrailcenter.org

- After touring the trail center, venture off heading west on I-80 to the small town of Carlin where you will view interpretive signs, walk around the nature trails, and view wildlife at the Chinese Gardens.

- Visit scenic Carlin Canyon, which is part of the Emigrant Trail, where you can view more interpretive signs, take a hike, and watch wildlife.

- Next, it is back to Elko and enjoy lunch at one of our great restaurants.

- After lunch head East on highway I-80 to the town of Wells, Nevada where you will visit the Trail of the 49ers Interpretive Center 436 6th Street, 775-752-3540.

- While in Wells take Highway 231 up to beautiful Angel Lake scenic byway. This spectacular drive presents a panoramic view of the Humboldt Mountains for spectacular views, hiking trails, wildflowers, fishing, and wildlife.

- After this fun-filled day on the history of the California Trail it is time to head back to Elko and dine at one of our "Only in Elko" restaurants.

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SCENIC WONDERLAND/ HISTORIC DOWNTOWN

- Take a scenic trip to the quaint town of Lamoille via State Route 227 (Lamoille Highway), about twenty miles south through Spring Creek. Continue up the 12-mile Lamoille Scenic Byway for unforgettable vistas of the glacially carved Ruby Mountain Wilderness.
- Enjoy a hike up to one of the beautiful alpine lakes.
- Visit the Little Church at the Crossroads. It is in a picturesque setting against the backdrop of the Ruby Mountains and is one of the most photographed places in northeastern Nevada.
- While in Lamoille have a tasty lunch at O'Carrols or if you come later in the afternoon stay for dinner at the Pine Lodge.
- When you arrive back in Elko it is time to enjoy a stroll through classic, upbeat shops in historic downtown and take the self-guided walking tour of murals, western boots and other sculptures including a photo with the Elko Centennial Tower.
- Experience Elko's night life featuring casinos, clubs, pubs, and breweries.



WESTERN ADVENTURE TOUR

- Saddle up for a true taste of the Wild West at the Western Folklife Center www.westernfolklife.org, which houses the Wiegand Gallery and 20-seat Black Box Theatre.
- Across the street is J.M. Capriola, home of the Garcia bit and spur. Watch an expert saddle maker complete intricate stamping and display his skills.
- Nearby, the Cowboy Arts & Gear Museum, which displays exquisitely decorated antique saddles and other vintage tack, also preserves the area's ranching heritage.
- "Basque" in Elko history at the Northeastern Nevada Museum; view mastodon elephant fossils, an original Pony Express cabin, collections of historic firearms, Basque history and much more. Dinnertime, it is off to a Basque restaurant for the dining experience of a lifetime.

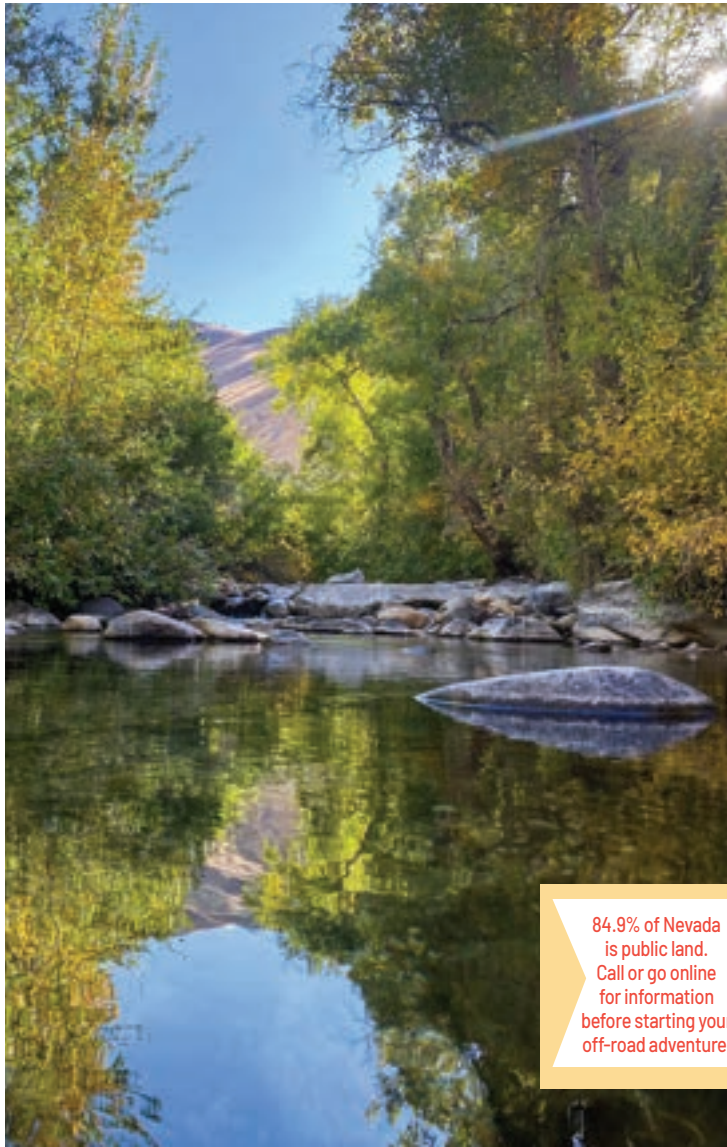

PLAN CAREFULLY AND THINK AHEAD

The Elko area terrain and climate can present some unexpected and new risks to even the most experienced outdoor recreation enthusiasts. To ensure safe adventures, please consider the following precautions:

• CHECK ROAD CONDITIONS

before starting a drive. For up-to-date road condition information, call 877-NV-ROADS or 511, download the NV Roads app or visit the Nevada Department of Transportation road conditions website at nvroads.com.

• CHECK THE WEATHER

FORECAST. Be prepared with layers of clothing, weatherproof outer layers and extra clothing and socks in your vehicle and/or backpack to change in case you get wet. Hypothermia can be a risk year-round, especially in the higher elevations of northeastern Nevada.

• **WHEN DRIVING**, be sure to have a full tank of gas and carry equipment such as chains, shovels and sand to get unstuck if your plans are to go off-road.

• **PACK EXTRA** water and non-perishable food items in case your travels are delayed.

• **CELLULAR SERVICE** can be intermittent throughout rural, undeveloped areas of northeastern Nevada. Let someone know when you're heading out on your adventure, where you're going and when you expect to return.

• **WINTER ADVENTURISTS** should be prepared and knowledgeable about avoiding potential avalanche areas. If you do venture into avalanche prone areas, be sure to take the proper safety equipment with you. An avalanche beacon checkpoint has been installed in Lamoille Canyon to support outdoor enthusiasts.

OUTDOOR RECREATION

TRAILS FOR EVERY SKILL LEVEL

The Elko region offers a variety of outdoor recreation, including bicycling and running. Numerous marked and unmarked trails can accommodate most any level of skill. Terrain and elevation vary widely, so it is best to check if they are passable during the winter months.

Closer to town, the Elko SnoBowl features scenic biking trails across its landscape.

According to runner and bicyclist Leslie Creel, some of the best places to run include South Hills at the end of Ninth Street. She also enjoys the trails around Summit Estates. These are hilly, unmarked trails.

Hardcore trail runners may want to check out Ruby Mountain Relay.

Easier routes are available in the Elko area, such as the HARP Trail, which runs adjacent accessible right in town.

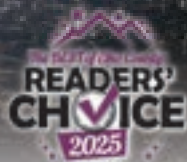

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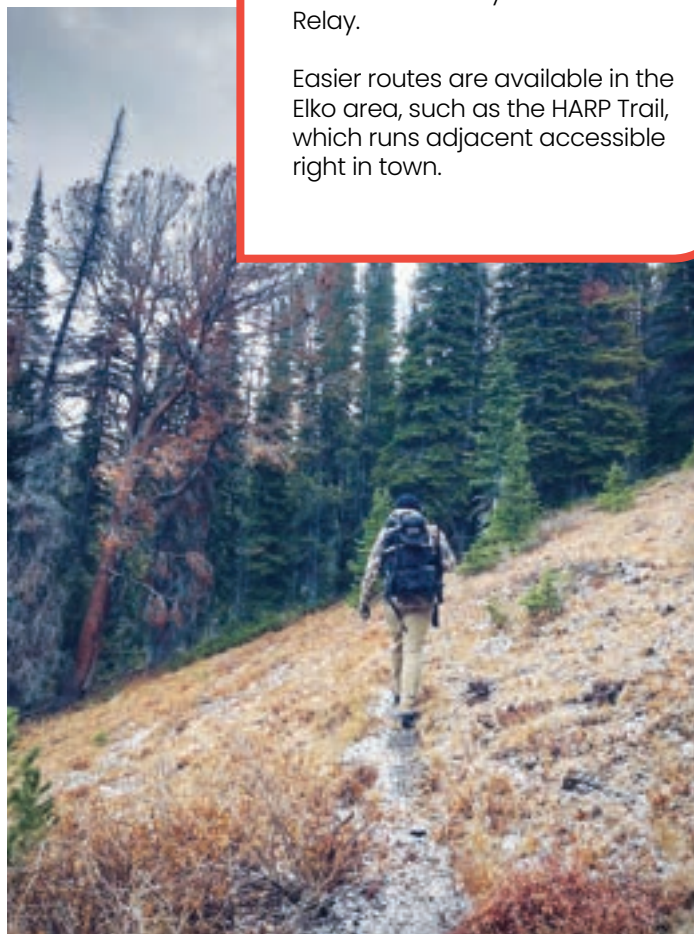
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OHV OPPORTUNITIES

Northeastern Nevada's vast open spaces offer nearly unlimited opportunities for Off Highway Vehicle enthusiasts.

Elko City Officials have gotten behind the OHV community and allow trail access within the city limits. You are able to access gas, groceries, and a room in your OHV as long as you adhere to the standards put in place for safety. Nevada has an Off Highway Vehicle registration that must be purchased prior to operating your vehicle on any public land or roadway.

Travelers will be able to operate on Nevada lands so long as their out-of-state registration is current and won't be used for longer than 14 days.

Money raised from the Off Highway registration goes into the construction and maintenance of the Nevada trail system. Registration can be completed by mailing your completed application to the OHV division of the Nevada DMV. All applications and fees can be found at www.ohv.nv.gov



TOP 5 OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE TRAILS

1. HARRISON PASS AND CORRAL CREEK

Multiple trails are located at the top of Harrison Pass (7,247 feet) for all levels of riding. Summits overlook sweeping vistas of the Ruby Valley and Ruby Lake National Wildlife Refuge.

- Distance from Elko: 42 miles

2. SPRUCE MOUNTAIN

Spectacular mountain views from any direction along Spruce Mountain Ridge, just east of Clover Valley. Climb through spreading aspen groves and sparkling mountain streams and find plenty of memorable riding trails. Explore remnants of old mining camps.

- Distance from Elko: 87 miles

3. STAG MOUNTAIN, CHARLESTON AND JARBIDGE

Explore one of the most remote areas in Northern Nevada. The Jarbidge Mountains form a diamond shape with eight of their peaks over 10,000 feet. Stag Mountain is a day trip. Charleston and Jarbidge would require overnight camping.

- Distance from Elko: 40 miles

4. SCHOOL AND SHERMAN CREEK

Rooted in ranching history, the trails surrounding School and Sherman Creek are perfect for spotting wildlife and taking in the beauty of open meadows.

- Distance from Elko: 65 miles

5. MERRITT MOUNTAIN

Located north of Elko and east of Wildhorse Reservoir. Rich in historic mining culture as well as beautiful scenery and abundant wildlife, near the ghost towns of Patsville and Rio Tinto.

- Distance from Elko: 85 miles

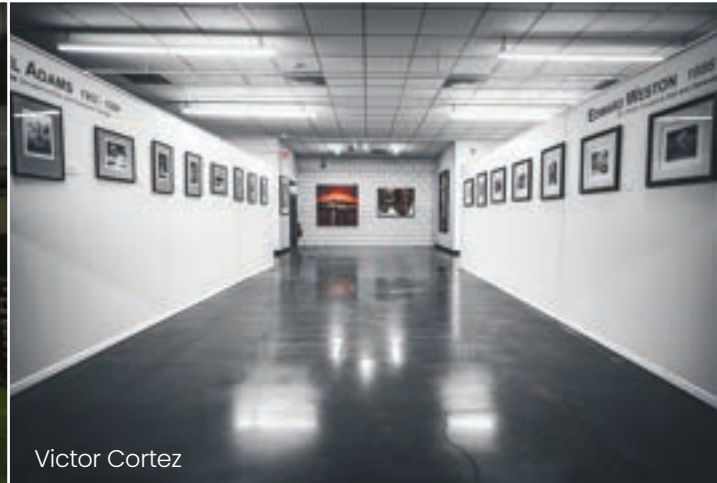

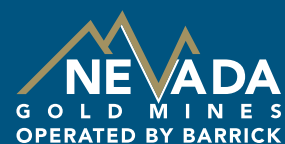

HIKING ADVENTURES

RUBY CREST NATIONAL RECREATION TRAIL (SOUTH TRAILHEAD)

Situated along the spine of the Ruby Mountains, this well maintained trail has many hikes to choose from ranging from 39 miles (62.8 km) in length. Elevation rises 2,400 feet with abundant wildlife and spectacular alpine scenery including glacial valleys, lakes, and streams.

- Distance from Elko: 42 miles

ROADS ENDS – LAMOILLE CANYON

Popular trailhead located at the end of the highway through Lamoille Canyon. This unique granite canyon formed by slow-moving glaciers offers a wide variety of trail hiking opportunities. Hike to several beautiful mountain lakes including Lamoille, Island, Dollar, Liberty, Favre and Castle Lakes.

- Distance from Elko: 25 miles

WINCHELL LAKE

Well marked trail located on Angel Lake Road is 4 miles (6.54 km) long, contouring the East Humboldt Mountains with a 700-foot change in elevation. Early in the season the trail is enhanced by ample displays of wildflowers in bloom.

- Distance from Elko: 68 miles

SOLDIER BASIN

Trail accesses a beautiful high elevation basin with several lakes and spectacular scenery. Trout fishing is available at Soldier Lake, Robinson Lake, and in hidden lakes and streams along the route. The trail can be accessed from two sides of the Ruby Mountains.

- Distance from Elko: 36 miles

OVERLAND LAKE

The trail climbs from Ruby Valley to a 2,700 foot elevation at Overland Lake, along a well-marked trail through Aspen groves and meadows with wide open views of Ruby Valley below. There is no water along the 6.4 miles (10.5 km) route until you reach Overland Lake. Fishing and wildlife viewing is available at the lake. A historic cabin is located near the shore, but please leave it as you found it.

- Distance from Elko: 60 miles

HAMILTON BULLION

Drive South on 5th Street through Elko. Turn west on Wilson Avenue and follow 1.3 miles (1.2 km) to Hamilton Stage Road. Turn south and drive approximately another 1.3 miles (1.2 km) on dirt road. Take the right fork. Trail begins in 1.5 miles (2.4 km).

Enjoy a day of sunshine in the outdoors.



LAMOILLE CANYON

Lamoille Canyon lies in the heart of the Ruby Mountains, Nevada's wettest mountain range. This spectacular byway winds around the base of the 11,387-foot Ruby Dome and climbs through the glacier-carved canyon to 8,800 feet. Four geology-interpretive panels lead travelers past meadows bursting with blazing wildflowers, abundant wildlife, waterfalls, and avalanche chutes. Mountain goats, big horn sheep and an array of birds can be seen carefully perched in the rocky outcrops above.

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STARGAZER'S PARADISE

WHERE THE NIGHT COMES ALIVE:

DARK SKIES OVER ELKO

Elko and its surrounding areas are a paradise for stargazers and astrophotographers, thanks to their high elevation, low humidity, and minimal light pollution. The vast, open spaces of northeastern Nevada provide some of the darkest, most pristine night skies in the contiguous United States.

CELESTIAL SIGHTS TO LOOK FOR

DEPENDING ON THE TIME OF YEAR, YOU CAN SPOT A VARIETY OF CELESTIAL WONDERS:

- **The Milky Way:** Visible as a bright, cloudy band across the sky, the Milky Way is one of the most popular sights to behold in a truly dark sky.

- **Planets:** Bright planets like Jupiter and Saturn are often visible and can be a thrilling sight, especially through a pair of binoculars or a telescope.

- **Meteor Showers:** Elko's dark skies are perfect for watching annual meteor showers like the Perseids in August and the Geminids in December.

- **Constellations:** Without the interference of city lights, the constellations appear in sharp detail, making them easier to identify.

Whether you're a seasoned astronomer or just someone who appreciates a beautiful night sky, the dark skies of Elko and its surrounding areas are an unforgettable experience. Be sure to check a local weather and moon phase forecast before you go, as a clear sky and a new moon will give you the best viewing conditions.



SUMMER RECREATION

SUNFLOWER FLATS/MERRITT MOUNTAIN

Located east of Mountain City Highway and north of Wildhorse Reservoir, the area is rich in historic mining culture as well as beautiful scenery and abundant wildlife. This trail will connect the Wildhorse Reservoir area with the historic town of Mountain City, which includes a Forest Service Visitors Center. It also goes near the mining ghost towns of Patsville and Rio Tinto.

This trail is well-suited to families with children, senior outdoor recreationalists, beginner ATV, as well as the off-highway SUV driver and snowmobile riders during winter months.

- Distance from Elko: 85 miles



SOUTH FORK STATE RECREATION AREA

South Fork State Recreation Area boasts flourishing meadows and rolling hills filled with northeastern Nevada wildlife. Sightings of mule deer, badgers, beavers and kit foxes are common. With the Ruby Mountains as a backdrop, visitors easily and eagerly enjoy hunting, boating, swimming and fishing. The expansive reservoir holds an abundant cache of catfish, bass and trophy size trout. A variety of waterfowl grace the lake, including ducks and geese. A 25-site campground includes campsite tables, grills and a restroom with showers.

- Distance from Elko: 18 miles



LAMOILLE CANYON SCENIC BYWAY

Lamoille canyon Scenic Byway runs 12 miles (22.3km) through this U-shaped, sheer-walled canyon which is home to Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep, mountain goats, mule deer, Himalayan snowcock, and a variety of peak-dwelling birds.

- Distance from Elko: 25 miles

ULTIMATE FISHING SPOTS

Elko County offers some of the best high desert fishing in the West. Whether fishing the high mountain lakes of the Ruby Mountains, the myriad of small streams throughout the county, or the lower elevation reservoirs, there is something for everyone.

LAKE FISHING

The Ruby Mountains and East Humboldts have 16 high elevation lakes that offer trout fishing. Six of them hold Lahontan cutthroat trout, while 11 hold brook trout. The most accessible high mountain lake is Angel Lake, holding brook, rainbow and tiger trout.

Two of the more popular lakes are Lamoille Lake and Island Lake, both accessed from the trailhead at the end of the road in Lamoille Canyon. Both require short, two-mile hikes that take about an hour and a

half. A mile and a half past Lamoille Lake is Liberty and another few miles of hiking will take you to Favre Lake both on the Ruby Crest Trail.

ICE FISHING

Elko County offers opportunities for ice fishing during the winter months. Some popular ice fishing spots in Elko County include South Fork Reservoir, Wild Horse Reservoir, and Ruby Lake National Wildlife Refuge. Ice fishing enthusiasts can target various species such as trout, bass, and catfish.

It is important to note that ice fishing can be a potentially dangerous activity, and safety precautions should always be followed. Before venturing out onto the ice, it is crucial to check the thickness and quality of the ice to ensure it is safe for fishing. Additionally, it is recommended to fish with a partner, wear appropriate clothing and gear, and carry safety equipment such as ice picks and a flotation device.

ICE FISHING ADVENTURES

WILSON RESERVOIR

This remote lake boasts great trout fishing. The improved gravel road leading to Wilson may be closed by weather. Call the Bureau of Land Management before attempting to travel.

- Distance from Elko: 90 miles

SOUTH FORK STATE RECREATION AREA

This 1,650-acre reservoir is accessible by paved road and freezes late in the season. The large trout in this reservoir provide fast action at times.

- Distance from Elko: 16 miles

WILD HORSE STATE RECREATION AREA

Very popular ice fishing spot featuring trout and yellow perch in abundance. This reservoir also has access from a paved road and freezes early in the season.

- Distance from Elko: 70 miles

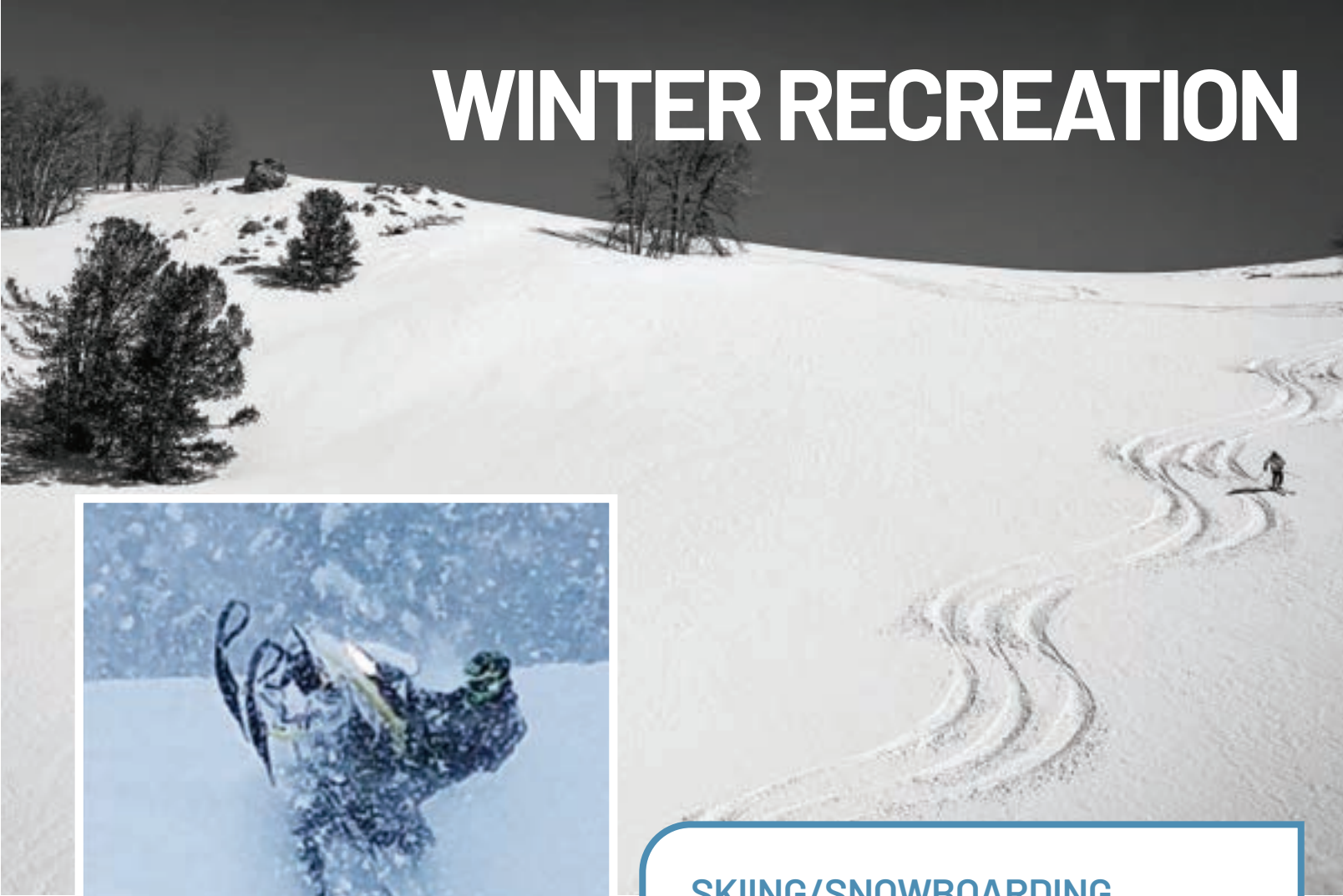

- Distance from Elko: 65 miles

JACK CREEK AND INDEPENDENCE MOUNTAINS

Start your adventure from Jack Creek Lodge to discover this mountainous ranching country with the Independence Range on the east and the Tuscarora's on the west. With a nearly 4,000-foot rise in elevation, the Independence offers a wide variety of terrain for all levels of experience.

- Distance from Elko: 58 miles

NORTH FORK, CHARLESTON AND JARBIDGE

Up to 30 feet of snow can fall in this rugged winter wilderness, providing a variety of unique challenges for snowmobilers. Snowmobiling is prohibited in designated Wilderness areas.

- Distance from Elko: 55 miles

HARRISON PASS

For a bit more adventure beyond the popular snow play areas, take a scenic drive out to Harrison Pass, where a variety of slopes offer plenty of space for sledding and winter fun.

- Distance from Elko: 42 miles

SNOBOWL SKI AREA

The SnoBowl offers groomed slopes perfect for sledding and playing. The close location makes it ideal for a quick recreation visit.

- Distance from Elko: 5 miles

LAMOILLE CANYON SCENIC BYWAY

This gorgeous alpine canyon is popular with year-round recreation enthusiasts. The paved road offers easy access.

- Distance from Elko: 25 miles

CROSS COUNTY SKIING/SNOWSHOEING

The 120-acre state park surrounding Wild Horse State Reservoir offers miles and miles of open cross-country skiing areas from Sunflower Flats to Merritt Mountain. Elevation rises 1,700 feet and offers beautiful views of the Independence Range.

- Distance from Elko: 65 miles

JACK CREEK

Trail elevations rise nearly 2,000 feet in the mountains surrounding Jack Creek. Opportunities for all levels of skiers are available.

- Distance from Elko: 58 miles

RUBY LAKE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

Plenty of rolling space is available on the 37,632-acre refuge for beginners to practice their cross-country skills.

- Distance from Elko: 65 miles

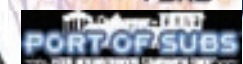
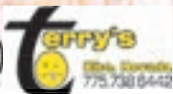

TUSCARORA

Although placer gold was discovered in 1867 it did not flourish until 1869 until the first Chinese moved into the area. In the 1870's it became a silver mining town but fires plagued its existence. The town still thrives with a few people living there.

THE PERFECT ARTIST RETREAT

Visit the old carriage stop turned into the Tuscarora Pottery School. This historic pottery school still offers classes in the summer. To learn more about the school and view their class schedule, visit tuscarorapottery.com or call 1.775.401.1054.



PALISADE

Founded in 1868 as a station on the Central Pacific Railroad. Population of approximately 600 with churches, lodges, businesses, and a residential district. After local area mining declined along with disastrous flooding and the closing of the railroad the town died out. Two buildings remain along with an extensive cemetery.

FORT RUBY

Established in 1862, Fort Ruby safeguarded overland mail coaches and the Pony Express through eastern Nevada, ensuring communication between California and the rest of the country. Declared a National Historic Landmark in 1961, several original log structures remain.

HARRISON PASS

A 1500-acre ranch was established in 1865 and by 1897 mining activity started. In 1916 a scheelite deposit was found and mining camps were erected. Today mill foundations are still visible.



METROPOLIS

Established as a model farming district by the Pacific Reclamation Company, of New York in 1909. It boasted a population of 700 at its peak but unforeseen circumstances caused it to die and only ruins remain of once was a thriving community.



CHARLESTON

Founded in 1876, it was originally named Mardis but was renamed after a local miner in 1900. Mining continued until 1942. It is a predominately ranching area today.

JARBIDGE

Known as the last big boomtown of Nevada, the first prospecting began in 1860's. Several more discoveries were made in 1909 and the boom lasted until 1932. It is still a thriving community known as a popular recreational area.



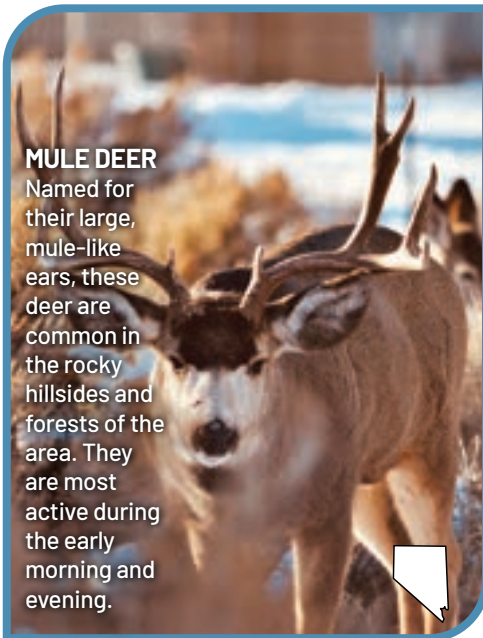
GOLD CREEK

Placer gold was discovered in 1869. The town enjoyed such amenities as electric lights, a water system, telephones, and other conveniences. In June of 1898, mining in this area ended. Only a concrete sidewalk remains where there used to be a thriving town.

JACK CREEK

Established in 1869 soon becoming a stop on the Northern Stage Company's line from Tuscarora to Mountain City. It boasted of a store, a restaurant, a rooming house as well as the Jack Creek Opera House for many years. After 1886 the property was sold and developed for travellers, fishing parties, hunters and became a local sportsmen's mecca.





MULE DEER

Named for their large, mule-like ears, these deer are common in the rocky hillsides and forests of the area. They are most active during the early morning and evening.



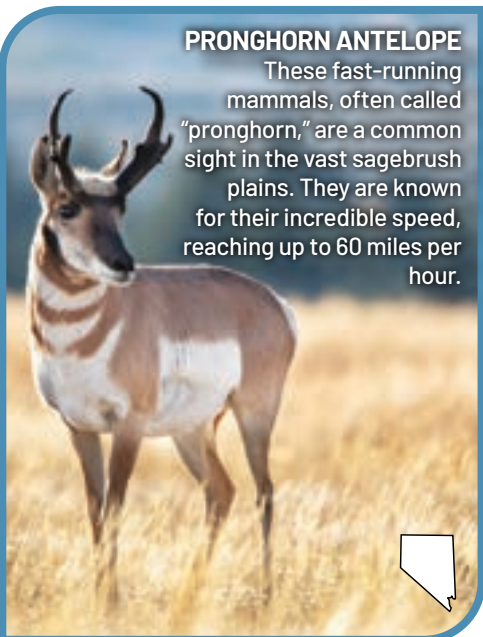
ROCKY MOUNTAIN BIGHORN SHEEP

These large, wild sheep are known for the massive, curled horns of the males. They are excellent climbers and can often be spotted on the steep, rugged cliffs of the Ruby Mountains and East Humboldt Range.



MOUNTAIN GOATS

With their long beards and white coats, these animals are well-adapted to the high-elevation, rocky terrain. Look for them on the Lamoille Canyon Scenic Byway, where their hooves allow them to navigate seemingly impossible cliffs.



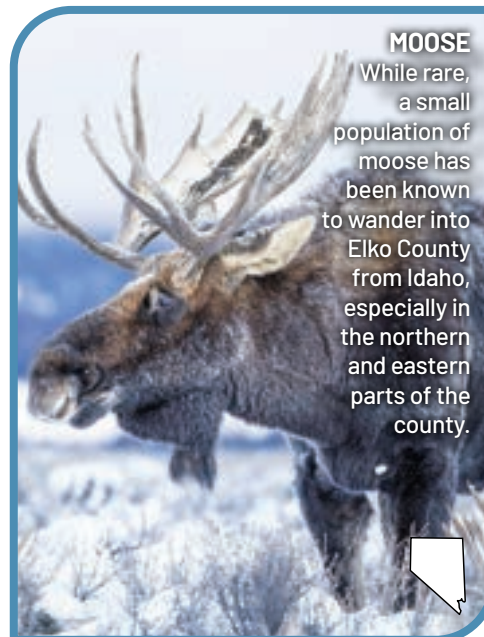
PRONGHORN ANTELOPE

These fast-running mammals, often called "pronghorn," are a common sight in the vast sagebrush plains. They are known for their incredible speed, reaching up to 60 miles per hour.



NORTHEASTERN NEVADA WILDLIFE BINGO

Elko County, Nevada, is a diverse landscape of mountains, sagebrush plains, and wetlands, offering a chance to see a variety of wildlife.



MOOSE

While rare, a small population of moose has been known to wander into Elko County from Idaho, especially in the northern and eastern parts of the county.



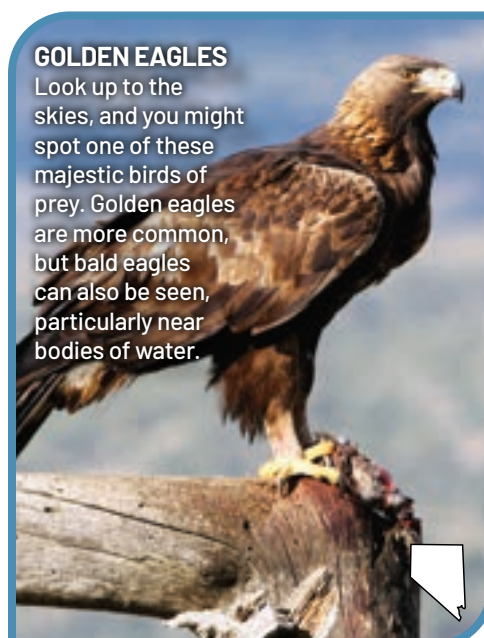
GREATER SAGE-GROUSE

This large, ground-dwelling bird is a key species of the sagebrush ecosystem. They are famous for the elaborate mating dances of the males, which take place in the spring.



MOUNTAIN BLUEBIRD

Nevada's state bird, the male mountain bluebird is known for its bright blue plumage. They are a beautiful sight to behold and are found year-round.



GOLDEN EAGLES

Look up to the skies, and you might spot one of these majestic birds of prey. Golden eagles are more common, but bald eagles can also be seen, particularly near bodies of water.



GREAT BASIN SAGEBRUSH

In the heart of northern Nevada, the Elko area is a haven for nature lovers and explorers alike. WILDHORSE STATE RECREATION AREA

This sprawling 120-acre recreation area is located on the northeast shore of Wildhorse Reservoir. Recreational opportunities include camping, boating, hunting, fishing, mountain biking and picnicking. Favored winter sports are snowmobiling, ice fishing and cross-country skiing. Amenities include 33 campsites, hand-pump water, picnic area, boat launch, swimming area, vault toilets and showers. To get to Wildhorse from Elko drive north on Mountain City Highway (State Route 225) 67 miles.



ANGEL LAKE

This 10-mile scenic byway climbs 3,000 feet in elevation to Angel Lake, affording spectacular views of the Clover Valley. Favorite activities include picnicking, fishing, non-power boating, backpacking and hiking.

Angel Lake Campground has 26 sites and 9 picnic areas. Angel Creek Campground and picnic area, located eight miles south of Wells on Highway 231, has 18 sites and a group picnic site. Potable water, vault toilets and on-site hosts are at both campgrounds. Advance reservations can be made by calling 877.444.6777. Take I-80 east from Elko to Wells, getting off at exit 351. Follow Highway 231 up to Angel Lake.

SPRUCE MOUNTAIN

Located east of U.S. Highway 93 south of Wells. The trail goes to the site of the historic mining ghost town of Spruce Mountain, complete with abandoned structures and equipment, as well as several abandoned historic mine sites, such as the Black Forest and Killie mines.

It winds through varied terrain and elevations, offering wildlife viewing opportunities such as deer, elk, wild mustangs, raptors, and other birds, smaller mammals, and the occasional mountain lion track. The trail crosses several distinct ecosystems, from sagebrush flats to grazing meadows to mountainous evergreen forest to mountaintop barrens above the tree line.

RUBY LAKE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

This national landmark, located about 65 miles southwest of Elko, is characterized by natural marshes, open ponds and islands surrounded by wet meadows and grassy uplands. Limited waterfowl hunting is permitted in season and the refuge is open for large-mouth bass and trout fishing year-round. To reach the refuge from Elko take I-80 east, getting off at Halleck, exit 321. Follow State Route 229, Ruby Valley Road, until you see the sign for the refuge on the left.

The campground has potable water, vault toilets, fish cleaning and an RV sanitary station.

HARRISON PASS/HUMBOLDT-TOIYABE NATIONAL FOREST

Harrison Pass, part of the Humboldt National Forest, is located 42 miles from Elko. The top of the ridge, at an elevation of 7,247 feet, provides a stunning view of Huntington Valley. To get to Harrison Pass from Elko, drive southeast on State Route 227 toward Spring Creek. Turn south on State Route 228, drive 33 miles and connect to the partially paved Harrison Pass Road (County Road 718).

Folklife Center activities include concerts, exhibits, workshops, educational programs, gift shop and the world renowned National Cowboy Poetry Gathering.



ELKO COMMUNITY ARTS

Though modest in population, Elko has in recent years developed a vibrant arts scene rooted in Western, Indigenous, Basque, and cowboy/ranching traditions. Its cultural identity and public art programs actively reflect its history, geography, and community values.

CENTENNIAL BOOTS

In celebration of Elko's centennial in 2017, the Centennial Boots project placed over four dozen 6 foot tall, decorated cowboy boots throughout the town, acting as public art nodes and photographic attractions. These boots evoke the town's Old West and cowboy identity, linking past and present in a playful, visual way.

LEATHERWORK & SILVERSMITHING

The Cowboy Arts & Gear Museum (in the restored G.S. Garcia building) actively presents and preserves leather and silver craft traditions. It offers workshops and demonstrations in leather stamping, rawhide braiding, and silver engraving. J.M Capriola Co sells handcrafted leather goods (belts, saddles, wallets, headstalls, chaps) they also offer silver engraved Garcia bits and spurs and maintain a small museum/workshop on the second floor.



ELKO THEATRE

Elko, Nevada's community theatre scene, is a vibrant and integral part of its cultural identity, blending education, performance, and civic engagement. Anchored by groups like the Silver Stage Players, which has entertained audiences for over 80 years, and the Elko High School Theatre Department, Overland Stage Theatre Company, Ghost Light Production, Elko Starlight Productions, & Great Basin Theatre Program. Productions range from classic plays and musicals to radio theatre and original works. Beyond entertainment, these programs offer educational opportunities in acting, stagecraft, directing, and technical production, fostering local talent and building future leaders in the arts. Elko's community theatre not only enriches the city's cultural life but also strengthens its sense of identity and connection.

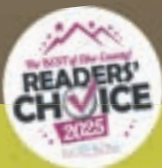

ELKO BASQUE CULTURE

BASQUE TRADITIONS

Drawn by the promise of opportunity, the lure of gold and the freedom in the New World, Basque people migrated from France and Spain settling in Nevada with Elko being the central hub and the West during the early to mid-1800s. Many found work as sheepherders and made Elko their home. Today, their rich heritage endures, celebrated each year through a lively festival filled with music, food, entertainment, and cultural traditions.

Basque traditions continue to thrive in the region today. Celebrations often feature Basque pelota (a traditional sport), folk dancing, euskal kantua (songs

in the Basque language), and communal meals like txistorra (Basque sausage) and paella. These events honor the culture and strengthen the bonds between descendants and their ancestors, keeping the Basque heritage alive in the American West.

The Elko Euzkaldunak Club, established in 1959, actively preserves Basque customs through dance, music, language, and the traditional card game Mus. Its highlight is the National Basque Festival, held every Fourth of July weekend since 1964, featuring parades, authentic cuisine, rural sports, and lively cultural performances that attract visitors from across the country.

Throughout the year, Basque heritage is celebrated in Elko through family-style restaurants like The Star Hotel and Toki Ona, as well as cultural institutions such as the Western Folklife Center. Though sheep ranching has declined, Elko remains a proud center where Basque traditions intertwine with Western ranching culture, creating a distinctive and enduring identity.





ELKO NATIVE AMERICAN CULTURE

NATIVE AMERICAN CULTURE

Long before Elko had a name, the Western Shoshone people made this region their home. Today, the Elko Band of the Te-Moak Tribe of Nevada invites visitors to experience Native culture firsthand at its annual pow-wow. Additionally, the California Trail Interpretive Center features a full Shoshone village, offering guests an immersive glimpse into traditional life.

Western Shoshone Indians are the descendants of an ancient widespread people whose name is "Newe/Numu" meaning "The People." The traditional Western Shoshone territory covered southern Idaho, the central part of Nevada, portions of northwestern Utah, and the Death Valley region of southern California. This vast land of mountains, valleys, deserts, rivers, and lakes offered an abundance of wildlife and plants for the Shoshone to hunt, fish, and gather. The Newe/Numu knew their lands and cared for its natural balance; Today the Newe/Numa fight to protect the land, for them it was the land of plenty, and to preserve their cultural, traditions and language. The Te-Moak Tribe of Western Shoshone Indians is a federally recognized Tribe with its own Constitution amended in 1982 and Corporate Charter approved in 1938.

The Te-Moak Tribe is comprised of four Bands: Battle Mountain Band, Elko Band Colony, South Fork Reservation and the Wells Band Colony.

The Duck Valley Indian Reservation is the ancestral homeland of the Shoshone-Paiute Tribes of the Duck Valley Indian Reservation and is located on the border of Idaho and Nevada, covering nearly 290,000 acres. The Shoshone-Paiute Tribes of Duck Valley are governed by the Business Council. The Business Council is composed of a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and five Council Members, all of whom are elected to serve three-year terms. The Business Council directs the Tribal government. The Chairman manages the operations of Tribal government. There are four divisions of tribal administration: Health & Human Services, Judicial Services, Tribal Programs, and Support Services.

Farming and Ranching are still mainstays for Duck Valley and is reflected in the 12,000 acres of subjugated lands. The Duck Valley Reservation is composed of 289,819 acres held in trust by the United States Government for the use and occupancy of the Shoshone-Paiute Tribes. Included in the total acreage of the Reservation is 22,231 acres of Wetlands. Wildhorse Reservoir was constructed in 1936 for the Duck Valley Irrigation Project. Tribal membership is over 2,000 with approximately 1,700 living on the reservation. The Shoshone-Paiute Tribes of Duck Valley continue to exist within the original territories of their ancestors.
