



Elko Trail Fest FAQ –

Is this event open to full-size vehicles (trucks, Jeeps, or other 4WD)?

No. For the first year, the event is limited to OHVs (SxS/UTVs only). If participation supports it, full-size vehicle options may be considered in the future.

Can we camp at the trail rides?

This event is not suitable for onsite camping with a toy hauler or RV, as you would need to pack up and relocate daily. While much of Elko allows OHV use on county roads, many routes to the trailheads require travel on state highways and I-80, making it impractical to ride to the start locations.

Are we camping overnight on the trail?

No. All rides take place during daylight hours.

Are meals included? What about lunch?

A Friday night meal is included for the driver. Additional meals can be added during registration.

For trail rides, participants should bring their own lunch or snacks. Some routes may include stops where food is available, but it is best to be prepared.

Can we have beer or alcohol on the trail?

No. Permits and insurance do not allow alcohol. Additionally, rides occur at higher elevations, where alcohol can have a stronger effect. Alcohol should be reserved until after the ride.

Helmets — are they required?

Yes. Helmets are required for all riders. They protect participants and help ensure a safe, responsible event for everyone involved.
